It is a nice feeling in the campus with children from every nook-and-corner of this country living together, sharing their experience and learning. As you may know, we have taken several steps to ensure that the students, who are fresh from Schools and from every region speaking different languages are placed comfortably. We have assigned one Teacher Mentor for every 30 students. This Teacher Mentor will meet every student under his/her care every week to look into their requirements, to advise them on academic work and to take care of their needs. To provide on the spot help on a day-to-day basis, we have a "May I Help You" desk at the University. In fact this group helped the children in booking train tickets to join their parents during Dassera Holidays. In order to spend more time with the parents, we had deliberately scheduled longer holidays for Dassera. All of us, you and your wards have a common goal: Academic excellence Excellence in Career National Pride. In this context, I wish to share with you some important issues :-

1. Students will have to attend at least 75% of the classes scheduled, failing which they will not be allowed to write the University examinations. Hence you as parents should ensure that your children don't stay back or stay longer at home missing the classes. Hence ensure when they come on holidays they don't overstay.
2. Cell Phones are useful. But having Cell Phones inside the University Campus and in the classes is prohibited in the interest of all students as they distract the students from academic work. Therefore, please don't try to disturb your children from 8 am to 5 pm. Advise your children not to take their Cell Phones to the University Campus. If they do, then the authorities may have to seize the Cell Phones and take action against erring students. So advise your wards never to take Cell Phones to the Campus and never to keep a Camera Mobile in hostel.
3. You may know that we have already held 2 Tests. The test marks are posted in the website. You have been given the access code. Please see periodically the attendance position and also the marks secured by your Ward by yourself. It will help you in guiding your Ward better without any embarrassment.
